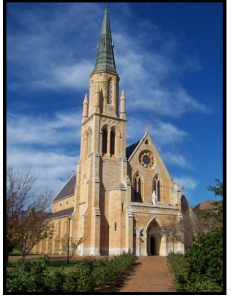

MASS TIMEABLE FROM SEPTEMBER

After much discussion, input and suggestions from our various parishes I have decided the best way forward for me at this point is **Option 1 (printed on last week's bulletin) - beginning Sunday 3rd September.**

It seems the suggestion of a Saturday morning Mass in either Gulgong or Kandos/Rylstone is not suitable for the majority of the people. With most parishioners in these places being senior citizens the evening Mass doesn't work with night driving and the cold in the winter. There has been some discussion about changing weekend Mass times in Mudgee, this is just not possible at this time. Mudgee requires both the Saturday and Sunday Masses as the size of the parish is much bigger than Gulgong and Kandos/Rylstone. However there will be at some point a need to have a Service in the Absence of the Priest in Mudgee on some weekends and Liturgy of the Word with Communion on weekdays.

At the moment Saturday's in Mudgee are very busy with over eighty baptisms each year occurring mainly on a Saturday and 20 marriages and every so often a funeral as well.

There are so few active priests in the diocese at this time, with no replacements for holidays etc. Other Parish changes could occur in order to facilitate the excess work load of one priest with three Parishes.

By having Mass on alternate Sunday's this will enable the priest to do a Baptism at either Kandos/Rylstone or Gulgong on that Sunday when required, and Mudgee at 1.00pm if necessary.

These times have been discussed with the Bishop and met with his approval.

We now need to train people who are able to lead the Service in the Absence of the Priest in readiness for the new Mass Roster from September.

IN FOCUS - REFLECTION ON GOD'S WORD

Hospitality

One of the nicest things in life is to meet an open, friendly, warm, hospitable person. Hospitality is a hallmark of a true follower of Christ.

At long last winter ended and spring came. All along the street the people rejoiced. They drew back their curtains and opened up their windows. Fresh air, sunlight, and warmth poured into their homes. 'Thank God for spring! Thank God for the sunshine!' they exclaimed.

Just then a beggar appeared at the end of the street. He was quickly spotted through the open windows. One by one, down the length of the street, the windows were quickly closed, the curtains silently drawn, and locks put back on the doors. The beggar knocked on every door on the street, but no one opened to him.

Forlornly, he left the street and headed for somewhere else. No sooner had he disappeared than the curtains were pulled back again, and the windows and doors opened up once more. And again the sunshine and fresh air poured in, and all the people rejoiced.

Strange how our homes are always open to receive God's sunshine and fresh air, but not always open to receive a child of God, especially when he comes in poverty.

Christ urges us to be hospitable. Nowadays hospitality is a very different matter from what it was in the old days when nobody locked their doors. Sadly, those days are gone. Today is the day of locks, bolts, chains, peep holes, alarm systems, dogs ... Yet today there is more need than ever for hospitality and friendliness. In the world today there is a lot of loneliness and there are lots of strangers, aliens, and displaced people.

Hospitality to a friend is no big deal. There is no risk involved, and there is every likelihood that the favour will be returned. But hospitality to a stranger is a great thing. You don't owe anything to a stranger, and there is a risk involved.

But Christ calls us to welcome the stranger in our midst. To be hospitable does not mean making them like us. It means accepting them as they are. This enables them to shed their strangeness, and become members of the community.

If Christians get into ghettos where they secure themselves and their property against those they consider as socially inferior to them, what hope is there for the world? Christ calls us to reach out. And the rewards are enormous. He said that even a trivial act of kindness, like giving a cup of cold water, would not go unrewarded. But there are earthly rewards too, and very great ones – the growth of understanding, friendliness, and cooperation, things our neighbourhoods are crying out for.

Hospitality is not so much about open doors as about open hearts. There is a risk in having an open heart. One can get hurt. But to open one's heart is to begin to live. To close it is to begin to die.
