

GOSPEL REFLECTION:

In the regions where Jesus was an itinerant preacher, three or four flocks could be kept in a communal sheepfold for safety. In the morning, the shepherds would come and, as each called out, the sheep attuned to the sound of his voice would follow to life-giving pasture.

We are surrounded by hundreds of voices clamouring for our attention. We are bombarded by messages, social media incessantly chattering. Jesus invites us to get attuned to his voice, listening for the distinctive sound of it so that, even if it is faintly heard in a cacophony, we immediately turn toward it so that we can follow it in a life-giving direction.

How do we get attuned to that voice? By reading the gospels. A Chinese student once told me that the Chinese character for gospel is 'happy sounds'. I like the plural. Jesus' gospel voice is not a monotone but a polyphony sounding in different ways in different situations.

As disciples, we have to get onto the same wavelength as that voice so that we can echo it in our own lives. We become reverberations of Christ's voice in many different situations, helping him to lead others to life-giving pastures.

We could take a moment to pray for better listening so that we might recognise the gospel voice of Jesus Christ, especially at the moment of death. Then we may hear the one voice we need and long for: 'Today you will be with me in paradise.'

Good Shepherd Sunday 2018

Today is the *World Day of Vocations*.

Pope Francis tells us:

We will never discover the special, personal calling that God has in mind for us if we remain enclosed in ourselves, in our usual way of doing things... We could lose the chance to dream big and to play our part in the unique and original story that God wants to write with us.

God calls young people from our local communities to serve as priests and consecrated religious. We all have a role to play in helping young people to 'dream big' and hear this call. What can I do to foster vocations from this community?

Pope Francis – Message for 2018 World Day of Vocations

'It will not fill our hearts if we keep standing by the window with the excuse of waiting for the right time, without accepting this very day the risk of making a decision. Vocation is today! The Christian mission is now! Each one of us is called to become a witness of the Lord, here and now.

'We should not wait to be perfect in order to respond with our generous "yes", nor be fearful of our limitations and sins, but instead open our hearts to the voice of the Lord.'

A prayer request

You might know of a young person in the parish, in your family or an acquaintance whom you think would make a good priest or religious. Why not pray for them by name on a regular basis? Carry them with you 'spiritually' to Mass on Sunday. Sometimes the Lord uses us as his instruments to encourage vocations.



Dear Friends in Christ,

"The Good Shepherd is one who lays down his life for the sheep."

On Good Shepherd Sunday, we thank God for the gift of our priests and seminarians. This is a gift to us from both God and them. God calls, but the one called must answer. In gratitude for their generosity, we should be generous too. We can do this with our willingness to work together in true Christian service as members of the Church. We can do this by supporting our priests and seminarians spiritually and materially.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders, through which God gives us priests, is a marvellous gift to the Church. Like any gift, it is sometimes not appreciated and lies unused. Sometimes, it is used badly. The world does not understand this gift. Even for people of faith, including priests themselves, it is a mystery that we only begin to grasp.

The first letter I wrote to the priests of our Diocese was about St John Vianney, the patron of parish clergy. It concluded with these words:

Vianney was not thought to have great human gifts, an evaluation he probably shared. He was as aware as anyone of the "dirty clothes" of the Church. But he knew that the Church was more than she appeared to be. He acted out of faith that the power of God's love in word and sacrament, by which and for which he was a priest, was the source of any good he might do. Connected to that source, he did great things and so can we.
