Message for Lent 2018

Dear Friends in Christ,

The season of Lent is about to begin, and with it the opportunity to renew our faith together.

The Christian journey is not a road that we walk alone. We travel with one another, receiving and giving support and encouragement, held together in the love of Christ.

The readings for Ash Wednesday remind us of the complementarity of the individual and the communal in our relationships with God. In what Jesus calls that 'secret place' we meet with only God in prayer. However, we do not stay there all the time. The love of God urges us out to meet all the others whom God loves too.

The prophet Joel calls for a solemn assembly, a common fast and the intercession of the priests for God's People. I invite you to take every opportunity provided in your parish to ponder the Word of God together, to meet for prayer and sacrament together, to join with others in works of service.

This year, we join all Catholics in Australia by beginning Lent with four days of prayer, fasting and reparation for those who have suffered childhood sexual abuse, especially in our own church family. Each parish will observe this together in its own way, and each of us can join his or her prayer and penance to this common intention.

Finally, St Paul's words express the radical message of the Gospel we proclaim and seek in Lent to understand more truly: "For our sake God made the sinless one into sin, so that in him we might become the goodness of God."

REFLECTION

We know that we will all have to face some kind of suffering, and so we try to prepare ourselves for it. Yet when it comes, as prepared as we try to be, it can overtake us with such fury that we fall back defenceless. We look to others for support and assistance, and if we are fortunate, we find it. However, even in the most supportive of communities, suffering tends to alienate us from those who are healthy and secure. Suffering reminds us of our own finitude and the contingent nature of all of life. It threatens our sense of order.

Jesus is not deterred by human suffering. He welcomes all who approach him; his healing touch reincorporates those who have been ostracised; his loving embrace re associates those who have been alienated. In the reign of God, there are no outsiders. All belong to Jesus, and, therefore, all belong to each other. When the one afflicted is embraced by the community, the community is an authentic manifestation of the inclusive reign of God.



In suffering we witness human vulnerability and our desperate need of each other and of God. There, at the edge of life and on the fringes of the community, we may experience the tenderness and compassion of God. The loving touch of Christ that can heal our souls, if not our bodies. It is there that we may most authentically participate in the cross of Christ. Joined to him we are anything but unproductive or worthless.
