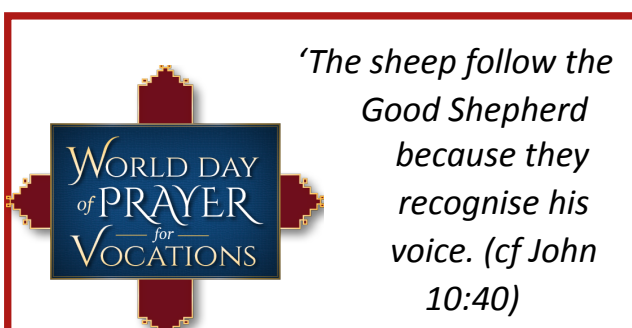

**GOSPEL REFLECTION:**

When Jesus appeared to them, the disciples thought they were seeing a ghost, a sort of projection of a human image on the screen of the world but with no human depth and vitality. In fact, ghosts seem to drain life and warmth from those they encounter.

The disciples became convinced that they were in the presence of the Risen Lord Jesus Christ when he assumed a characteristic way of acting – sharing a companionable meal (of fish).

His bodily presence of *that* sort is now withdrawn from us. But we are now encountered by him in the Mass which has many dimensions, one of which is that of a sacred meal. When we share in the sacramental signs of his Real Presence in the Heavenly Bread and Spiritual Drink of Holy Communion, he brings us the life and warmth of the Risen Son.

In fact, he shares his very life with us, and because his life is gloriously fully human, we become less ghost-like as he heals those parts of our personality which drain goodness and vitality from the world.

We could take a moment to pray to take greater opportunities to share in the Real Presence of Our Risen Lord under the appearance of bread and wine. This will move us from the illusion of being alive to that vitality which is nourished by his glorified humanity.

**PLEASE NOTE:** You must sign the book available in the Reconciliation room before you leave to go to the Nursing Home/private homes. This is a Diocesan regulation.

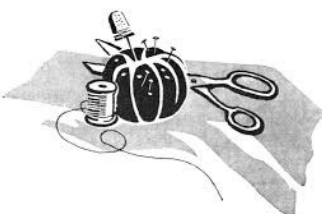

### Worshipping God in Prayer and Sacrament

A Lenten flyer – with an explanation of the meaning of Lent and prayer suggestions has been sent to each Diocesan schools aiming to help families understand what Lent is all about.

### Building a Community of Love and Service

This group is looking for ways of raising awareness across the Diocese of needs of prisoners. The hope is to have materials for parishes detailing the ways we might assist. The Diocese of Bathurst has one of the largest populations of prisoners in NSW.

### Participation of Indigenous Catholics

## Gospel Connection - Take the Stand and Witness

Witnesses to the Resurrection? Yeah, I've met them, especially in hospital.



There was the patient with extreme hip pain who prayed for the people with more serious medical problems. There was the older patient who almost died but said she doesn't fear death because Christ had comforted her in prayer. There was the patient with cancer who was looking for a parish to join because he always kept "Jesus in my heart" – even though he felt rejected by the Church in the past.

I look back on the faith of those people and I say, "Christ is risen!"

### Are you a convincing witness to others?

That is this Gospel's challenge. Your faith might be the only "Gospel" that some people read. They'll read it in how you treat friends, family, and even enemies. They'll read it in your attitude towards poor people. They'll read it in how you use money and choose goals.

That's heavy stuff. We aren't perfect, and we mess up a lot. But don't worry. More than anything else, people will see the Gospel alive when you apologise, admit your failings, and start over.

You're a sinner. So am I. But we're still called to witness to the Resurrection by passing the Gospel with our generation down to the next generation. The Apostles took Jesus up on that. And the word has spread from generation to generation for two thousand years now. It's now partly on your shoulders. But God put it there because God has so much faith in you.
