Reflecting on the Gospel

(Mt 13:44-52)

17th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Today's reading gives us the third Sunday in a row where we hear from Matthews chapter on parables. Seven parables of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew appear in chapter 13. The setting is in the house, where Jesus continues to teach his disciples using this rhetorical device, often explaining the allegorical meaning to them. Though in today's reading Jesus asks them a simple question, "Do you understand all these things?" to which the disciples reply, "Yes." Of course, those at the liturgy today will only hear those words if the longer gospel reading is proclaimed.

This particular gospel reading preserves parables not found anywhere else in the New Testament. These parables either come from Matthew's special source or they are his own composition.

The reading begins with two parables: the treasure buried in the field, and the pearl of great price. Each is a side of the coin so to speak, with Jesus instructing his disciples that the kingdom of heaven is worth such a prize. In other words, once one encounters the kingdom of heaven, the proper response is to reprioritise all else in favour of this. It is worth selling everything else to possess this one thing.

The longer gospel reading gives one more parable, but it has another point. Rather than reinforce the lesson of the first two parables, the third - the net cast into the sea which brings in a terrific catch - has another message. The net is returned with good fish, but also with things that are not so good. The latter is thrown away. This then becomes the image for the eschatological judgement, a topic that Matthew addresses quite often. At the judgement, some will not be merely cast aside or "thrown away," but the angels will throw the wicked into the "fiery furnace." As we saw last week, this is a favourite Matthean theme, and it causes some scholars to posit that the parable is a Matthean creation, though certainly canonical Scripture that is both authoritative and inspired.

Matthew is sure to tell us there will be a final, definitive judgement and an unfortunate end is possible based on the decisions we have made.



Family Prayer

Something to Think About

Today we hear another Gospel story about the Kingdom of Heaven. How do you think we could help to bring about God's kingdom on earth? What would such a place look like? It would be a safe and enjoyable place where people are appreciated and loved. It would be a place where people's gifts are acknowledged and valued, where everyone is treated fairly, where people are honest and caring. Add some ideas of your own!

The Story

This week we hear Jesus tell the disciples that the Kingdom of Heaven is like finding a treasure in a field. Whoever finds it will go to extraordinary lengths to buy the field so that the treasure is theirs forever. Similarly, the kingdom is like some lovely pearls and the lengths one will go to in order to buy those pearls of great value.

Family Discussion

Talk together about how in the time of Jesus, people would sometimes hide their valuables by digging a hole in the ground and burying them. If the person forgot about them, the goods could stay buried for years. Legally they belonged to the person who owned the land, but might be discovered by someone else such as a farm worker. They might sell everything they owned to buy the field and so be the owner of the buried treasure.

In today's gospel, Jesus tells us that the kingdom of heaven is so valuable, worth more than all our possessions, and that we would be very happy if we could sell everything in order to have it. Have a chat about what we can do to find treasure of God's kingdom in ourselves. What are the treasures of being a follower of Jesus?
