### REFLECTION by Fr Michael Tate

#### *Subverting the Social Order*

Jesus is on his way to fulfil the request of a named male synagogue official who has given voice on behalf of his ill daughter. Jesus is stopped in his tracks by an unnamed voiceless female who has been ostracised from the social and religious life of the town.

Part of her healing is to get her voice back. She tells Jesus everything and he addresses her with the beautiful title, 'Daughter'. Imagine the joy of this woman hearing such a term of affectionate relationship. Jesus went on: '... your faith has made you whole: go in peace and be healed of your disease.'

Jesus did not regard this as an interruption to his journey to heal the daughter of Jairus. Stopping was an absolute priority subverting the expectations and power structures of society. The healing presence of Jesus was, and is, radically egalitarian.

Perhaps we could take a moment to pray that we have the courage to touch the hem of Our Lord's cloak in Confession. There we can tell him everything which has left us ill-at-ease in our relationship with God, our fellow human beings and in ourselves. With confidence in his Divine power, we can ask him to heal the dis-ease in some part of our personality. Hear him respond: "Daughter (or son), your faith has made you whole: go in peace and be healed of your disease". Then, share in the joy of the woman of our Gospel story.

**Gambling On Jesus**

A man with a dying child; a woman desperately ill for a dozen years. Listening to these intertwined stories of miraculous healing, we know why the crowds were astounded. These two people found themselves in circumstances of great misery, and no one was able to help until Jesus arrived on the scene. Jairus, an official of the local assembly, took a risk in presenting himself to Jesus, who'd already been labelled a subversive for breaking Sabbath rest. But when your little girl is dying, you take chances. Jairus gambled on Jesus.

The bleeding woman was, if anything, more desperate still. She'd lived more than a decade ritually unclean, unable to be touched by her family, unable to participate in the life of the community. Her energy was constantly draining away, and she lived like a ghost, pale and unseen. Like Jairus, she clutched at grace when it came her way in the person of Jesus. If she paid any price for taking the risk, it was worth the hope of healing. People who dare to clutch at grace are not disappointed.

## PLANNED GIVING

You may recall that in June last year we did not renew our planned giving for the financial support of our parish due to Covid. This year I encourage all parishioners to now renew your support.

Our Parish is the focus of our faith life, our mission and outreach as disciples of Jesus. It is in these different times particularly, that we support not only each other in our Church community but our wonderful Parish School, St Matthews and our wider community.

Our outreach to the sick and housebound in our parish, our hospital and nursing homes brings great spiritual and emotional comfort to many and helps these people to feel connected to our parish. We support the great work of St Vincent de Paul through our parish resources. We look forward to our next community light lunch in a few weeks time, after our 12.30pm Friday Mass. Our next Men's gathering is in its planning stage for August.

Our parish nourishes and support the growth in faith and love of each parishioner beginning with our support of baptism preparation, through the steps in faith from the parish sacramental programs for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation, to the many young couples being prepared for marriage. The parish has continued to nurture our faith through our sharing of the scriptures in our Word and Faith group and as well as our Alpha group again this year, which explores life, faith and meaning. Your financial support helps us do all this and more, so thank you very much.

If you are able, could you please complete a new Gifting Card, and put it in the collection plate or drop it into the Parish Office or post it to us. This will help to update our parish records and maintain our Planned Giving records, which are a guide on projected income for future planning.
