Dear Friends in Christ,

As you would know, the public health restrictions we have been living with, on and off, during the pandemic, will start to ease in the coming weeks and months.

Once over 80% of the NSW adult population is vaccinated, churches will be able to reopen to everyone for public worship with numbers according to capacity, mask-wearing, no singing etc., as we have experienced before. That is estimated to be by the end of October, or sooner, if vaccination rates keep going at the current pace.

There will be a couple of weeks or less, after 70% vaccination is reached, when venues, including churches, could reopen, but only to those who have been fully vaccinated. After receiving legal advice and consulting with our parish priests, it would seem to be too onerous to ask parishes to monitor and implement that regulation, given the brief time it will be in force. So, during that time, there will be no public Masses in the Diocese.

As soon as we have an exact date for the reopening of our churches, that will be communicated in the usual ways, along with particular arrangements for each parish.

May we use this time to renew our focus on the meaning of Christ's gift of himself to us in the Eucharist. At last week's funeral of Sister Joan Farrell rsj, who served in many places across our Diocese, we shared her beautiful reflection on this loving exchange: "At Mass, I place myself on the plate; I offer myself with Him and He gives me Himself in return."

Covid Restrictions

Lockdown restrictions have been lifted in Mudgee, Gulgong and Kandos Parishes as of Friday 1st October.

THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTIONS APPLY...

- All organisations must continue to ensure they keep accurate records of all attendances, including through QR Codes, to enable fast contact tracing in the event of any community transmission.
- All parishioners are required to scan a QR code or sign in before entering the Church. Scanning QR codes are the preferred method as it does not require you to touch a common pen.
- The number of people allowed in a place of worship is limited to 1 person per 4 square metres.
- Mask are compulsory in all indoor non-residential settings and certain outdoor events.
- Singing by audiences and choirs at indoor venues or indoor places of worship will not be allowed.
- It is critical everyone continues to practise COVID-safe behaviours, hand sanitising, practising social distancing, staying home if unwell and getting tested if suffering from the mildest of symptoms.

As of the Monday 11th October, all Churches in our Diocese will be closed until the State reaches 80% vaccination. Once this has happen, all churches will be open to everyone.

Our Parishes and Diocese are guided by NSW Health. These restrictions can changes at any time.



The COVID-19 pandemic has been a challenging time for managing our mental health.

This Sunday's readings confront us with the need to make choices in life, choices for God. They also remind us that no significant choice is without its price. However, if we make the right choice, we are assured that we will be richly rewarded.

We all want to be happy in life. We just don't always know which doors to open, and how far to enter them. We need wisdom for that.
