I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.

Responsorial Psalm: <u>Ps 94:1-2. 6-9. R. v.9</u> (R.) If today, you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Second Reading: <u>1 Corinthians 7:32-35</u>


The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

REFLECTION

Discipleship requires a change in us. We want to change because in so many ways we are being strangled to death by demons. We are caught in dysfunction and sin; we live in the midst of the battle between good and evil, the struggle of human finitude and failure. We are plunged into the throes of human suffering and pain, and there seems to be no escape.

The demonic seduces us in more ways than we can count and we are often caught in its web before we recognise what has happened. There have always been many and varied voices that claim to have the remedy for our ills. Preachers and politicians have stirred up crowds and ignited their emotions.



Promises have been made and predictions advanced, yet the conflict goes on, the demons continue to hold sway. The demon recognised the authority in the voice of Jesus. Do we recognise it?

When we are released by Jesus from the demons that possess us, we are freed from the stranglehold of evil and liberated to live far less encumbered and divided lives. No Earthly reality will possess us, neither relationships nor obligations nor even religious practices. Rather, we will be possessed by Christ who liberates us for the reign of God. Therefore, whether married or unmarried, whether in the midst of the community or at its margins, we will be able to heed the voice of God in our hearts and to recognise Jesus in our midst.



Scriptural context - The Messianic Secret

A feature of the Gospel of Mark is an element of secrecy and confusion that surrounds Jesus' identity. He silences demons who would announce his identity and warns those he heals to be quiet about what has occurred. There is a real lack of understanding displayed by the disciples about who Jesus is. At one point, Jesus asks the disciples, 'who do you think I am?' They identify him as the Messiah but immediately demonstrate that they don't really understand what that means. The theme that runs through the gospel is a developing understanding of what it means that Jesus is the Messiah.

Expression of Interest Membership of Diocesan Finance Council

The Diocesan Finance Council is an advisory council established by the Bishop in accordance with the code of canon law of the Catholic Church to advise him in the stewardship and administration of the temporal goods of the Diocese, in accordance with sound principles of financial administration and legal compliance.

The Council is made up of people of good character and judgement, committed to the Church and with experience in finance, law, banking, property development and administration.

Meetings are usually held four times a year, for a duration of 2-3 hours, with detailed papers prepared and circulated a week before the meeting.

Council Members also are allocated membership of the Standing Committees of the Council, being the Catholic Development Fund Investment & Audit Committee and the Property Committee.

The Bishop is seeking nominations of people to be considered for membership of the Council. You may nominate yourself or, with their consent, another person you think may be suitable.

REFLECTION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

A major theme of the Scripture readings is 'Listen to the prophets'.

The passage from Deuteronomy is the basis of the Jewish belief that the Messiah, a saviour, would be a prophet like Moses. Christians see this belief fulfilled in Jesus.

The psalm calls us to greet the voice of the Lord and to listen with an open heart.

Paul serves as a pastor to the Christian community at Corinth. He calls them to look at their lives and at those things that get in the way of their relationship with Jesus. In effect, Paul is a prophet to that community and likewise serves as a prophet to us. The reading challenges us to promote good in our community and to promote that which will help us devote ourselves to the Lord.

In the passage from Mark's Gospel, Jesus expels a demon from a man. Jesus shows he has the authority to speak and act as a prophet sent by God. His exorcism of the demon demonstrates that good triumphs over evil. This miracle is the first of many Mark records to show both the authority and the compassion of Jesus. This passage also reveals the main work of Jesus – the work of forgiving, healing and teaching in the name of God.
