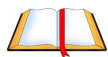

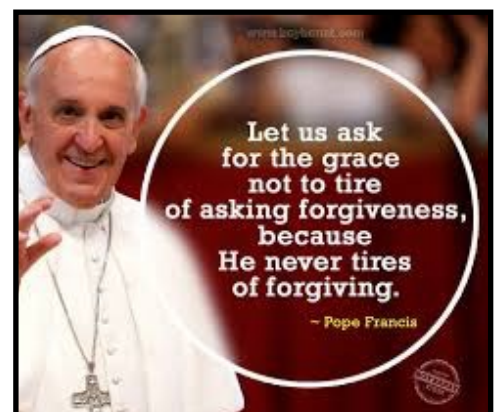
Project Compassion 2017

Give Us Grace to Love and Forgive

Our culture constantly encourages us to treat each other as adversaries. The word "enemy" is carefully avoided, but we are encouraged to be competitors, combatants, or challengers. Our legal and political systems, our sports and games, relations between employers and unions all involve treating the other as an adversary who has in some way to be overcome.

If we are feeling noble, we will speak of how much we respect our adversaries. Members of the Australian Federal Parliament, for example, address each other as "Honourable Member". But when the blood is up, our language quickly changes and degenerates. We begin to use phrases like "going in for the kill", or speak of "destroying" the opposition of their arguments.

Television as a medium thrives on providing simple, stereotyped, antagonistic views rather than reasoned debate, and violent films and series have great popularity. Sports develop crowds of fans whose strong emotions can spill over from chants of hatred to physical violence. Yet, if we were asked, most of us would say that we did not have any enemies, just people who got on our nerves from time to time.

Jesus offers us a very different message to the one given us in the patterns described above. He does recognise the underlying violence in human attitudes and behaviour. The lex talionis – the principle of "an eye for an eye" – was a definite advance on the law of the jungle, whereby the strongest imposed their will on the weak with no possibility of retribution. But Jesus offers a higher principle still. We are

not to impose our will on others but to be generous to those who hurt us, and to pray for them. Jesus will go on to model in his own life and death this most demanding of Christian principles.

We can have strange ideas about what perfection means. It can mean everything from keeping the house spotlessly clean to being untouched by any worldly concerns. For Jesus, however, being perfect consists in being filled with unconditional love, the love that God has shown to us. It means not being satisfied with love that is second best, love that is half-hearted or shallow. It means showing love to someone even though society might encourage us to be

HISTORICAL CONTEXT

Walk two miles

Roman soldiers were allowed by their own military laws to require any person to carry the soldier's pack along the road from one milestone marker to another. That is, they could order a man to walk one mile with their pack. If they made someone carry their pack for more than one mile, the soldier himself was subject to discipline and punishment. Jesus says, 'If anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him.' Like turning the other cheek, it is turning the tables on the one who would oppress you and bringing shame upon them.
