**ADVENT LITANY**  
**BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH**

**PRIEST:** God of all time and all seasons, you are the beginning and the end of all life, and your love for us is evergreen and eternal. As we begin our Advent time of preparing our hearts and minds for the birth of your Son, Jesus, we ask you to bless this wreath, that it may be a sacred symbol bringing grace and blessing to us as we use it during our Advent journey.

**ALL: Amen**

**PRIEST:** May this violet light remind us that we are waiting and longing for the coming of Jesus who is the true light of the world?

**ALL: We wait and long for Jesus, the light of the world.**



**THE ADVENT WREATH**

For many Catholic families, the centerpiece of their Advent celebration is the Advent wreath. It is a very simple item, consisting of four candles, surrounded by evergreen branches. The light of the candles signifies the light of Christ, Who will come into the world at Christmas.

Children, in particular, find delight in the ceremony of the Advent wreath, and it's a great way to remind them that, despite the Christmas specials on TV and the Christmas music in stores, we're still waiting for the Birth of Christ.

If you've never adopted this practice, what are you waiting for?

Shape your frame from wire or purchase one from a craft shop, buy some candles and collect some greenery and pine cones. Simple but effective. Light a candle each week with your family and pray the prayer from the bulletin.

**FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

**FIRST READING:** Isaiah 63:16-17; 64:: 1, 3-8  
*Oh, that you would tear the heavens apart and come down.*

**RESPONSORIAL PSALM:**  
***Lord, make us turn to you, let us see your face and we shall be saved.***  
O shepherd of Israel, hear us, shine forth from your cherubim throne. O Lord, rouse up your might, O Lord, come to our help. **(R)**

God of hosts, turn again, we implore, look down from heaven and see. Visit the vine and protect it, the vine your right hand has planted. **(R)**

May your hand be on the man you have chosen, the man you have given your strength. And we shall never forsake you again: give us life that we may call upon your name. **(R)**

**SECOND READING:** Corinthians 1 3-9  
*The revelation we looked for, Christ Jesus our Lord.*

**GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:**  
**Alleluia, alleluia!** Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. **Alleluia!**

**GOSPEL READING:** Mark 13: 33-37  
*Stay awake! You never know when the Lord will come.*

**MEMORIAL ACCLAMATION:**  
Save us, Saviour of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection You have set us free.

**REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSS**

- Today's readings contain several images: the faithfulness of those who suffer, even as they lament their predicament; the admonition to watch and wait; the expectation of the coming of the Day of the Lord. As trustees of the one who is coming, we live in the 'in between' time of ambiguity and hope. The placement of these readings at the beginning of Advent shapes the context for understanding the entire season. They fix our gaze on the world of human pain and then moves beyond it to the hope of a brighter future. Lamentation and expectation find fulfilment in the Day of the Lord.
- Waiting is a prominent image this Sunday. Some people wait to be released from suffering, others await the second coming of Christ. Waiting saps our energies and stifles our enthusiasm. Yet wait we must, and as we wait, we wonder: 'What should I be doing?' The readings suggest that we should wait with patient expectation for the day of reconciliation and peace; we should wait in joyful hope that what is to come will come soon. While we wait, we should faithfully fulfil our responsibilities. We believe that we have a future worth waiting for, that there are promises that God will keep. And so we look expectantly to the Day of the Lord, that future day of ultimate fulfilment.
