REFLECTION

The decisions called for in today's readings are life decisions. The people at the time of Joshua had to decide which god they would worship. The disciples of Jesus had to decide if he was the one who would fulfill their messianic expectations. We have life decisions to make as well. How will we choose?

The choices we make determine the character of our union with God. God called us out of the slavery of sin and protected us throughout the journey of our lives. Jesus walked with us through the challenges of life and performed wonders for us. Why should we look elsewhere? Because we face new challenges. The new demands placed on us may be so great, or the commitment required of us may be so demanding that we feel that we can no longer walk with him. The church may be changing in ways we do not appreciate, or it may not be changing in the ways we believe it should, and so we may feel that we can walk with him no longer.

If we decide to commit ourselves, we will enter into a union with God that is deeper than anything we have previously known. However, this union will be based on faith. We may understand no more than we did in the past, things may be no more to our liking. But, 'to whom shall we go?' Jesus is God's holy one; he has the words of eternal life.

IN FOCUS

Some Disciples Leave Jesus

During the Second World War certain Nazis killed some Jews and buried them in a mass grave. One twelve-year old boy was still alive. He dug his way out of the shallow dirt and went around the neighbourhood seeking



shelter in homes. The people knew what had happened and, when they saw the boy caked with dirt, they hurriedly shut the door in his face. One woman was about to do the same when the boy said: "Lady, don't you recognise me? I'm the Jesus you Christians say you love". The lady broke into tears and received the boy into her home. She had made her decision for Jesus.

Many people walked away from Jesus after he spoke about being the Bread of Life. This passage is often called "the crisis" in John's Gospel; Jesus loses a large portion of his followers back to the world after this. He turns to the Twelve, to test their willingness to remain. As usual, Peter represents the group with his fearless answer, "Lord, where would we go?"

Suppose you were to reject the life of faith today as being too demanding. The Church's teachings aren't contemporary enough. The leadership seems flawed. The liturgy needs work. The community is, for all its professions of faith, just a bunch of sinners. If you bundled all of your grievances against the Church into a handkerchief and tied it to a stick and got ready to walk, just where would you be going?

Most people who walk away in anger have only their anger for company. Most "retired Christians" I know still carry that handkerchief of outrage around with them, dangling from the stick. We can imagine that those who become disillusioned with Jesus muttered about it for years to come. "Some prophet he was. Some saviour!" But those who stayed with him and his words, got past the cross and all the way to Easter.

What is the hardest saying of Jesus for you? How do you live with it?

Perform a ritual of reconciliation with the Church itself. What has affected your relationship with the Church the most: that it has changed so much, or not enough? Ask for the ability to forgive and pray for the gift of understanding.

What do you think Jesus would look like if you met him on the street?

Did you ever miss seeing something that was easily observed later?

What was obstructing your view?

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
