The World Day of the Poor

"The World Day of the Poor wishes to be a small answer that the Church throughout the world gives to the poor of every kind and in every land, lest they think that their cry has gone unheard."

"Often I am afraid that many initiatives, by themselves meritorious and necessary, are intended more to please those who undertake them than to really acknowledge the cry of the poor....we believe that a gesture of altruism is sufficient without compromising ourselves directly."

"Poverty is not brought on by itself, but is caused by selfishness, pride, greed and injustice."

"Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of society."

"In order to overcome the overwhelming condition of poverty, it is necessary that the poor perceive the presence of brothers and sisters who show concern for them and who, by opening the door of their hearts and lives, make them feel like friends and family."

READINGS FOR NEXT WEEKEND:

World Day of the Poor Sunday 18th November.

His Holiness Pope Francis has designed the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, 18th November as the Second World Day of the Poor.

The Holy Father notes that there are many different forms of poverty and he asks us to consider "Who are the poor?" He describes how we only recognise the voice of the poor in silence and then, having listened, we must answer. Our responses, he suggests, calls for a "loving attentiveness which honours the person and seeks out his/her best interests.

"Poverty is not brought on by itself, but is caused by selfishness, pride, greed and injustice."

The Holy Father invites us to make concrete the words of the Psalm 22:27: "That the afflicted shall eat and be satisfied". His Message contains a very practical suggestion: the sharing of the Sunday meal with the poor.



Advent Reflection Books

This year's reflection book, 'Saviour', provides an opportunity for us to be still each day, listen to God and hear him declare to us as the angel declared to the shepherds: "Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11). Saviour is a 76 page pocket-size book containing short - spiritually rich - daily reflections from the beginning of Advent (2nd December 2018) through to Baptism of the Lord (13th January 2019).

Christ the King

Next Sunday we celebrate the 'Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe'.

We encourage all parishioners to wear something WHITE for this special celebration.

This final scripture reading of the liturgical year harks back to Good Friday. It is an excerpt from John's account of the passion. It presents the first exchange between Pilate and Jesus inside the fortress. The key issue emerges: the true identity of Jesus and the nature of his kingship.

The following Sunday we enter a new cycle of the church calendar, Year C, which reflects on the Gospel of Luke.



When the World Is Falling Apart

We've all had those days. The sun is shining, but everything seems so dark. It's a peaceful night, but pain

fills our heart. It seems like the world is ending.

Breaking up with a girlfriend or boyfriend, fighting with a parent, feeling rejected by a friend, failing a test — any or all of these things can bring our world crashing down. Things can get even worse for practicing Christians, who face even more difficulties at times because of the tough stands we must take to do the right thing.

This week's Gospel was written to give you courage during the tough times. The early Christians faced rejection and persecution. Mark's Gospel reminded them that Jesus is with his followers during the toughest of times. Even though everything may seem to be falling apart, Jesus' words "will not pass away."

That means that despite the troubles we face, you can

rest assured God loves you, God is reaching out to comfort you, and God will strengthen you. Yes, God is with you when you are alone. But often God wants you to reach out to others. As humans, we often need other humans to really feel God's embrace. Friends, counsellors, family, or members of your Church often bring Christ's help during tough times. So, don't isolate yourself when you hurt, or you might be keeping God's help at a distance.



Don't give up and turn away, because in the midst of your toughest times, you can see God's "power and glory."

When have you found God helping you out when part of your world seemed to be falling apart?
