The Jesse Tree

On this First Sunday of Advent, we present these symbols.

We remember *Creation*, "when the word was with God, and the Word was God".

We remember Adam and Eve who introduced sin into human history by their rebellious actions. The Bible affirms that every person who has lived since has followed their example.

We remember the *Fall of Man*. Adam and Eve were expelled from the Garden of Eden because they ate of the forbidden fruit.

We remember Noah. God warned Noah that he was going to wipe mankind from the face of the earth. God gave him specific instructions for building the ark by which Noah and his family would survive the coming flood.

We remember Abraham who is "our father" in faith. Abraham was ready to listen to God, and follow God.

We remember Isaac who was the child of a promise from God, born when Abraham and Sarah were elderly.

We remember *Jacob*. In a dream, Jacob was told that God would give the promised land to him and his descendants. God also promised to keep him safe, and in return Jacob promised to trust in God as the only true God.

READINGS FOR NEXT WEEKEND:

Advent

Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival. While we typically regard Advent as a joyous season, it is also intended to be a period of preparation, much like Lent. Prayer, penance and fasting are appropriate during this season.



Advent is not as strict as Lent, and there are no rules for fasting, but it is meant to be a period of self-preparation. The purple colour associated with Advent is also the colour of penance. The faithful should fast during the first two weeks in particular and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The colour of the Third Sunday of Advent is rose. This colour symbolizes joy and represents the happiness we will experience when Jesus comes again. The Third Sunday is a day of anticipatory celebration. It is formerly called "Gaudete" Sunday; gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin.

Finally, Sundays during Advent, just as during Lent, should not be given to fasting, but instead to celebration because we
 celebrate the resurrection of Our Lord every Sunday. It is important to remember, however, there are no particular rules
 for how the laity should observe Advent.





Do You Want to See?

Some days I just don't want to see anymore.



The nightly news shows people starving across the world. I see homeless people on my street corner.

That lonely person who never seems to fit in comes to me needing some extra time when I'm already busy and tired. Honestly, I don't want to see at times because I get tired of trying to help. I want to focus on just my life, my wants, my friends, my pleasure.

Have you been there?

If so, you're a pretty normal Christian. If so, Bartimaeus, is a good person to think about. He called out to see Jesus, asking for sight. Jesus granted his request. And when Bartimaeus could see, he stood up and followed Jesus.

Bartimaeus reminds us that we have a choice. We can be blind. We can turn away from people and problems that call us to show compassion and sacrifice. Or we can ask Jesus to help us see.

But Christians sometimes focus their vision just on helping others. The good thing is that Jesus helps us see more than that — a lot more. He helps us see how valuable we are to God and how much God loves us regardless of our strengths or weaknesses. God helps us to see the good friends coming into our lives through our service and discipleship. He helps us see that we can't help everyone — that it's critical to say no at times in order to rest, relax, and avoid burning out from helping others.

So don't feel down when you want to just turn away. Ask Jesus to help you see why you should turn back to him and where you can find the support you need to keep going. He'll show you. He always shows me. And, like Bartimaeus, you'll "see" that the best choice in life is to get up and start following Jesus again.
