Let the person without sin be the first to throw a stone.

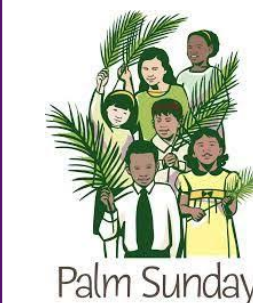

**Care About People -
Don't Use Them**

The way I treated Bill is, unfortunately, a perfect example of how different I am from Jesus.

I worked with Bill many years ago at a newspaper. We were both reporters. Bill was always friendly, but his clothes were often rumpled and looked old. I made fun of him behind his back, using him to make myself more popular. Bill probably needed a friend and some understanding, but I never spent time getting to know him or care about him.

Jesus was so much different. He shows that in this week's Gospel. His opponents drag a woman caught in adultery before him. Why? They want to trap him, hoping he'll speak against Jewish religious law. They care nothing about the woman, her embarrassment, or why she sinned. Maybe she's not as guilty as she appears. They simply use her. Jesus, on the other hand, focuses on the woman. He ignores their question and acts with compassion toward her.

All of us have probably hurt people by using them. Some people use others for humour. Some for sex. Some for a better mark or promotion. Sometimes people let themselves be used, especially lonely people who crave attention. We've seen this happen in society, at school, in the workplace, right? Pornography and prostitution also thrive because people let themselves be used and degraded.

It's sinful to use people, even when they agree to it. Lent is a good time to ask difficult questions. Have we used people? Do we have the courage of Jesus to stand up and stop others when we see them using people?

When have you used someone else or stopped someone from being used?

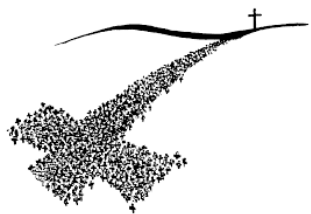


The Way of the Cross

Importance of the Easter Triduum

"Beginning with the Easter Triduum as its source of light, the new age of the Resurrection fills the whole liturgical year with its brilliance. Gradually, on either side of this source, the year is transfigured by the liturgy" (Catechism of the Catholic Church).

HOLY WEEK embraces the last days of Lent (until Thursday) and the Easter Triduum. The Sacrament of Penance is an excellent way to conclude the Penitential season of Lent. It is best celebrated *before* Holy Thursday evening so that, with heart and mind renewed, all way focus on the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, as a way of coming to the joys of the Sunday of resurrection with uplifted and welcoming hearts. SC110
