REFLECTION

In this final Lenten Sunday we look again at the significance of Christ in our lives. We recognise him as our saviour, but we look more closely in order to discover just what kind of saviour he is. He has taken the form of a slave; he has been glorified with a name above all other names; he continues to suffer with us. We have not been saved through military power, but through the self-offering humility of Jesus. Though he was really in the form of God, Jesus came in the form of a slave. We have a saviour who was crushed for our iniquities, nailed to a cross as a convicted felon, and there endured the sense of abandonment. In the face of this, we must ask a fundamental question: Why does God love us with such abandon?

We have a saviour who was lifted up and exalted precisely because he emptied himself of his divine prerogatives. He became one of us in order to show us how we are to live. Unlike conquerors who triumph by putting down their opponents, Jesus was raised up because he himself was first willing to be put down.

We have a saviour who first offered himself for us and then continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow. As he was willing to empty himself for our sake, so we are told to empty ourselves for the sake of others.

We have provided professional social services to many thousands of people experiencing poverty or disadvantage - we assisted 64,000 people nationally in the last 12 month period.

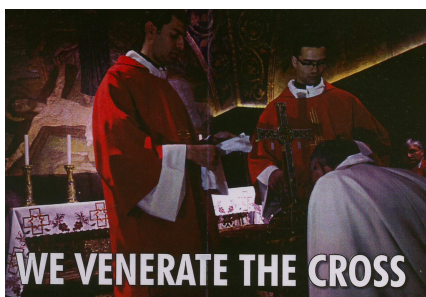


St. Vincent de Paul has given \$1.5 million to drought affected farmers.

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IN FOCUS**Blessed are the Merciful**

It seems to me that through my son's growing-up years, I have felt every slight pain, misunderstanding, rejection, etc., that he has experienced. He never walked to the same drummer and never dreamed the same dreams as his peers. To this day, he hears his own drumbeat, and for being different he has suffered, mostly unjustly. (Lots of joys in life too, not to overstate here). In today's gospel Jesus is on the cross, certainly unjustly, and still the crowds mock him. The leaders have no pity and even one of the thieves hanging beside him is jeering at him. The other one, though, understands that Jesus is innocent and did not deserve the punishment of the cross. Jesus said to him, "Today you will be with me in paradise".

Mercy ... Mercy is the other hand of compassion. We feel for another and we are drawn to take their part. We really and deeply care - as the good thief did for Jesus. "Blessed are the merciful," Jesus said to the crowd, "for they shall obtain mercy," again as the good thief did. Ponder the virtue of mercy today and try to extend it to anyone around you who is suffering or in need.

On this Palm Sunday, Jesus, you are greeted by the crowd with songs of joy. May I too greet you with love and praise. The crowd that cheered you, however, turned against you on Good Friday. May I be your loyal follower in good times and in bad. Hosanna, Jesus, I offer praise to you, may I give you joy in all that I do today and during this Holy Week. Have mercy on me when I fall. Amen.

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Importance of the Easter Triduum

"Beginning with the Easter Triduum as its source of light, the new age of the Resurrection fills the whole liturgical year with its brilliance. Gradually, on either side of this source, the year is transfigured by the liturgy" (Catechism of the Catholic Church).

HOLY WEEK embraces the last days of Lent (until Thursday) and the Easter Triduum. The Sacrament of Penance is an excellent way to conclude the Penitential season of Lent. It is best celebrated *before* Holy Thursday evening so that, with heart and mind renewed, all way focus on the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be observed everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, as a way of coming to the joys of the Sunday of resurrection with uplifted and welcoming hearts. SC110
