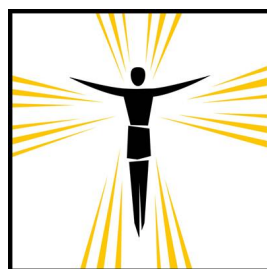

REFLECTION by Diane Bergant CSA

The Feast of the Ascension is really a kind of liminal moment in the Easter season. It is a time between times; a moment when we have left one place, but have not yet arrived at a second. While the narratives that describe the Ascension fit well into the unfolding story of redemption, the feast celebrates the exaltation of Jesus. The readings allow us to focus on this theological point while we commemorate a turning point in the life of the church. We do this by considering the enthronement of Christ in the heavens and the new body of Christ on earth.

Many of the Easter accounts have directed our attention to the appearances of Jesus which were intended to strengthen the Christians' belief in his bodily resurrection.

Today we stand awestruck, watching Jesus ascend into the clouds of heaven, there to be enthroned at the right hand of God. Today is a day to be overwhelmed by the reality of the divinity of the one whom we have known in his humanity.

Christ who ascended into heaven in his body carries on what he began on earth through his new body, the community of believers. He teaches through its apostles and evangelists. He ministers through its prophets and pastors. We have not been left alone; we have his power, the same power with which he performed marvels when he walked the earth. We have not been left alone; we have each other. Together we make up the new body of Christ.

Planned Giving Sunday

As we approach the end on another financial year we express our sincere gratitude to all parishioners who have supported our parish financially over this past year. Times are difficult for a number of families, yet these families continue to honour their commitment.

Without your financial support for our parish we cannot continue to do what we are called by God to do - look after the pastoral life and outreach of our parish which is our most important ministry. Thank you very much. To do this we must also pay the everyday running costs of electricity, rates, salaries, insurance etc. and attend to the maintenance of our heritage and other buildings for future generations.

This weekend we are asking all families in our parish to take up this commitment and to give what you can afford to our Planned Giving via the second collection which is for the support of our parish enabling us to carry out these ministries. You will see from the Financial Statements distributed in the seats today our expenses are higher than our income. When we all contribute something with a shared sense of responsibility it is easier to grow our parish community, celebrating our new life in Jesus in all events of parish life.

There are different ways of contributing. Sets of Planned Giving envelopes are available whereby you place your weekly donation or increasingly, many parishioners now give their weekly donation electronically via either:-

- direct debit through their bank account;
- or

- direct charge on their credit card.

All parishes are able to receive your weekly donation this way. All contributions to Planned Giving remain for the support of our parish.

We ask all parishioners to fill out a New Gifting Card, even if you are already in the programme. The diocese is in the process of changing banks so it is really important especially for those using the card system so we have accurate details to re-enter the information into the new banking system.

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The First Collection supports the parish clergy including a stipend and presbytery expenses, support for the Bishop and his work and the care of those clergy who have ministered across our diocese and have now retired.

Living the Gospel – You will be my witnesses

Organisers of the twenty-third World Youth Day hosted by Sydney in 2008 took as its theme verse 8 of the passage from Acts 1 that is today's first reading: 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be my witnesses.' The choice of this theme for a worldwide gathering of young people of faith is a significant reminder of the call of Jesus to go out to the ends of the earth and to bear witness to his message. These are the final words on earth attributed to Jesus and they echo to us through time.

IN FOCUS

Don't Look Up



The portraits of the Ascension I like the most are the ones that begin and end with Jesus' feet. Of course, the heads of the disciples gather at the bottom of the frame, staring upward with open mouths. But all we see of Jesus are his feet disappearing at the top edge of the picture. His great exit is in process, and all that will be left behind is the advice of a couple of angels.

Don't look up, the angels say. Look out. Look within! Don't get caught up in what is already past but see what's happening right now. Participate in the kingdom, which is coming in every new decision, in each word and action, in your relationships, in the choice of love, compassion, and forgiveness! The angelic advice is all about perspective. If we focus too much on heaven, over which we have no control - if we view religion as a matter of "what goes up" - then we'll miss what's "going down" all around us. And that's something about which we have a lot of control, not to mention a lot of responsibility.

The Ascension tends to get lost in the "what goes up" phase of our imagination. We, too, look up until our necks ache, forgetting that the story we're being told is neither history nor biography, but gospel. The gospel is faith spoken to faith. The gospel speaks to believers about the meaning of what they believe. Once Jesus returns to the One who sent him, our business lies not with the realm we can't see but the busy, complicated, tangible world we are immersed in.

In the celebration of Jesus' Ascension, we recognise that we ascend, too, through the grasp of what binds us to our brokenness and sin. In all these ways, Jesus comes again, and we meet him, eye to eye, right where we live.
