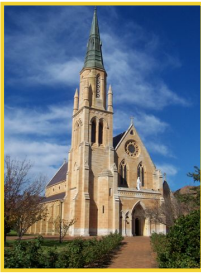

Mission and Renewal -
Catholic Diocese of Bathurst**

The Co-ordinator of Mission and Renewal will support parishes in the task of mission and renewal. The co-ordinator will collaborate with parish and Diocesan leaders to assist parishes and individuals to live the mission of the Church and encourage lifelong discipleship.

The Co-ordinator of Mission and Renewal reports to Director of Mission and Renewal, who reports to Bishop McKenna. Initially, this role will be a 2-year contract with a standard probationary period and options for renewal.

Key Areas of Accountability will include:

- Assistance with development and delivery of parish formation programs
- Assistance with the development and delivery of parish and mission projects
- Assistance and collaboration with Diocesan agencies
- Involvement with and support of the Diocesan Pastoral Council

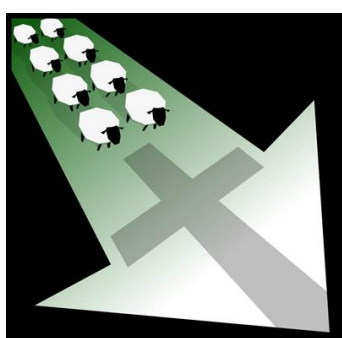

He's Appointed You Too



Their faces lit up. They hadn't realised the difference they would make. After all, they were just four teens.

They believed in peace. So they decided to start a youth retreat to teach how Christians can fight racial prejudice.

The four young people glowed with confidence after the leaders they helped choose for the retreat day ended a day of training. They looked on as their young leaders from all parts of the globe shook hands and committed to join them in their peace project.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others" to "cure the sick" and announce that "the kingdom of God is at hand".

This Gospel tells a story that's two thousand years old but also brand new. These four peace-building teens heard Jesus' instructions as clearly as the first disciples. Like them, they went forward on faith. They didn't know if other young people would welcome their ideas or ridicule them. Like the first disciples, the four teens also cured sickness by helping other young people take a stand against prejudice. And like the first disciples, they were amazed at the power Jesus gave them.

Did you know Jesus has appointed you too? Many young people doubt themselves. Some look in the mirror and think they can't make a difference. I think those first disciples thought the same thing. Remember, they were ordinary people. Most were probably poor and uneducated. They probably felt powerless too, until Jesus came into their lives.

Then they changed the world. But the job's not done. Just look around and you'll see plenty of sickness. Will **you** go when he sends you?

What sickness in the world should you, or do you, help cure?
