




REFLECTION by Diane Bergant CSA

It was not enough to want to follow Jesus and to be committed to him. Discipleship also demanded the ability to make shifts in understanding in order to recognise what following Jesus required. He did not merely repeat the religious tradition, he re-interpreted it. We too are called to understand the words and deeds of Jesus, but we must understand what they mean for us today. Today we need to make comparable shifts of understanding in order to bring the message of Jesus into conversation with the contemporary world.

Perhaps one of the most exciting and, at the same time, unnerving aspects of our religious tradition is its nonconforming nature. We think that we finally understand the way God is working in our lives and then something happens that seems to turn our understanding inside out. We are told to love our neighbour and when we ask who that might be we are told a story that turns the question around. 'Who is my neighbour?' or 'Whom should I love?' becomes 'Who acts as a neighbour?' or 'Who shows love?'

The same Sunday that we reflect on the paradoxical nature of the ways of God, we are told that the law of God, which appears to be so lofty, is really very close to us, in our mouths and in our hearts. This too is an unusual claim. Following the law results in a way of living that is inspired and informed by love, love of God and love of others, even, and perhaps especially, those whom we are not inclined to love.

HOLY COMMUNION: The more complete form of participation in the Mass by which the faithful receive the Lord's body from the same Sacrifice is strongly endorsed. Vatican 11, SC 55

It is most desirable that the faithful receive the Lord's Body from host consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the cases where this is foreseen, they partake of the chalice so that even by means of the signs, communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated. *GIRM 85*

Communion under both kinds

Drinking from the chalice is the preferred method of receiving the Blood of Christ because of the Lord's command: Take and drink. If intinction is used, it is the minister who dips the host in the chalice and places it in the communicant's mouth. GIRM 286-287

A Story That Needs Retelling

Just days after 9 – 11, an angry mob gathered blocks from a Chicago area mosque. The mob marched toward the mosque to seek revenge for the 9 – 11 attacks. Mob members apparently reasoned that all Muslims are terrorists because a few Muslims used their faith to justify mass murder.

Religious bigotry, which caused so much hatred in Jesus' time, is alive and well. What did Jesus say about it? This week's Gospel tells it all.

Many Jews in Jesus' time shunned Samaritans because they were the descendants of Jews who had married people from different ethnic and religious backgrounds. So Jesus must have shaken this scholar of the Law and his prejudices when he made the Samaritan the good guy in this story.

The mosque I mentioned found protection that night, and later many local Christians spoke out against the religious bigotry that spurred the march. Thus, they retold the story of the Good Samaritan in their own words. Is that a story you're willing to share?

My Neighbour

Late for an important meeting, I was running for a bus when I tripped and skidded headlong on the footpath. I hopped back on my feet and caught up with the bus, huffing and puffing and embarrassed. The stares from people in the crowded seats and aisle tipped me off to the fact that my hands and nose were bleeding. I hid my hands in my jacket pocket after trying to wipe the blood from my nose. I felt rather uncomfortable, and in the age of blood-borne diseases, a pariah.

A man I knew very well from church turned his head to look intently out the window. A woman reading her Bible kept her head down reading. A bag lady who everyone had avoided looked at me and reached into one of her shopping bags. She pulled out a fresh, pristine packet of facial tissues. Her face contorted into a chipped-tooth smile as she handed me the little packet. I smiled at her, ever so grateful for her kindness.

I had made jokes about "bag women" in the past and felt guilty. And I'd slipped a few dollars to such women from time to time and felt secretly proud. Today, I finally looked at the woman and saw her for who she was - my neighbour.

Position Vacant: Co-ordinator of Mission and Renewal - Catholic Diocese of Bathurst

The Co-ordinator of Mission and Renewal will support parishes in the task of mission and renewal. The co-ordinator will collaborate with parish and Diocesan leaders to assist parishes and individuals to live the mission of the Church and encourage lifelong discipleship.

The Co-ordinator of Mission and Renewal reports to Director of Mission and Renewal, who reports to Bishop McKenna. Initially, this role will be a 2-year contract with a standard probationary period and options for renewal.
