

ASIA EMERGENCY APPEAL



By now, you may have heard about Super Typhoon Goni, the most powerful storm this year which whipped across the eastern Philippines with tremendous force, destroying or damaging houses and villages across the country.

A staggering 402,458 families are affected across the Philippines, with the powerful winds of 225 kilometres destroying infrastructure in 5 regions and across 183 municipalities.

This comes just a week after Typhoon Molave killed over 100 people when it arrived in Vietnam, and days after Typhoon Quinta also made landfall in the Philippines on October 27.

Cambodia has also experienced heavy flooding in recent weeks, impacting over 100,000 families. By donating to our Asia Emergency Appeal, you're helping us respond quickly when disasters like these strike.

The Palms mission offers the rewarding challenge to truly reach beyond cultural, class and gender differences, to affirm the dignity of all while "promoting and implementing the development goals that are supported by our deepest religious and ethical values." (Pope Francis). Palms has adapted to 'COVID normal' and in an effort to respond to communities' requests for assistance, Palms will continue to prepare new mission applicants offering an Orientation Course in January 2021. Applicants will be thoroughly prepared for this cross-cultural mission in remote parishes, schools and communities as soon as international travel resumes. The Orientation Course will be conducted at Hartzer Park in the NSW Southern Highlands, and ensure these committed individuals are mission ready to enter the field as soon as travel resumes. Seeking Wisdom

For a few years I worked in downtown San Francisco. It's a lovely city by every standard, but it has one major drawback that gives newcomers pause: it's located on an earthquake fault line. When you ask long-term residents how they cope with the idea that at any moment, without warning, their entire world could collapse under their feet, they look at you with the amusement of experience. "You get used to it," they tell you.

Most people who live on fault lines dismiss the odds. They don't have the emergency supplies on hand that local phone books recommend: enough bottled water for several days, flashlights, spare batteries, a transistor radio. To non-residents, this seems like madness. But consider all the things you may not be prepared for. How many people go through life without health insurance? Who prepares for divorce, disability, or even unemployment? In some ways, we all go about without oil in our lamps, like the five in this week's story, playing the odds that we won't come up short.

One way to be prepared for any eventuality is to ground our lives, not in fluctuating circumstances, but in Christ. Though the earth shiver and crack open beneath us someday, we won't be lost if Christ is the bedrock upon which we stand.

What is the central truth upon which your life is grounded?

Will that truth support you 'come hell or high water'?

Keep vigil for wisdom. Make time for spiritual reading regularly, as well as prayer, solitude, and worship. Get into the habit of discerning God's will as you make decisions regarding relationships and resources.

The early Christians thought that all their questions about death had been answered with the resurrection of Jesus. Therefore, when loyal Christians began to die, not only did their old questions come back, but also they were plagued with new and difficult ones. Was it possible that those loyal Christians had not been loyal after all? Or worse, were the promises made by Jesus empty promises? No! Paul assures us. It is all true. Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again, and all the faithful will be joined with him. *How* it will happen, we do not know. *When* it will happen, we do not know. *That* it will happen, we are sure.

The wisdom that we have culled from life becomes the treasury from which we draw the prudence and insight needed to negotiate life's paradoxes. It throws light on our strengths and on our weaknesses; it enables us to discern what is important and what is not; it directs us to bring extra oil in our lamps. Life and the wisdom that we have acquired through it, have taught us that we can indeed trust the promises of God. They have been fulfilled in the past, and wisdom assures us that they will be fulfilled in the future. It is wisdom that cautions us to be vigilant, to be ready to adjust our plans. It is wisdom that prepares us for the night watches of life. It is wisdom that instructs us to be ready at all times.
