First Reading: *Is* 66:10-14

I will send toward Jerusalem peace like a river.

Responsorial Psalm: <u>Ps 65:1-7. 16. 20. R. v.1</u> (R): Let all the earth cry out to God with joy.

Gospel: <u>Lk 10:1-12. 17-20</u>

In today's Gospel Jesus tells us to pray to ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. If we truly want more labourers for the vineyard that produces the Good News of life in abundance for all, the same vineyard that also tells the Jesus story through the eyes and hearts of Aboriginals and Torres Strait Islanders, then praying is only one way to do this. We also need to make a deeper commitment to our sisters and brothers through being labourers in the vineyard.

NAIDOC has a theme this year of 'Get up, Stand up, Show up'. Labourers for the harvest of the Lord do exactly that — they labour or work for the Lord, and that can take the form of getting up and being active. There is much we can do as Christian people to address issues that affect our First Nations sisters and brothers.

I have my story of asking others for help to profile Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture – the world's oldest continuing culture - during my Episcopal Ordination. What is your story? When were you active with issues that affect First Nations people? And if you don't have a story yet of being a labourer in that vineyard, then get up, stand up and show up to places where issues of First Australians are

being addressed. People are just waiting to be asked.

The harvest is plentiful but the labourers are few.

Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Although the gospel is a report of ministerial commissioning, it contains elements of discipleship in general. Most obvious is the disciples' dependence on Jesus. They are not independent missionaries; they are followers. Furthermore, there is a communal dimension of discipleship. While there is certainly a personal relationship between Jesus and each disciple, discipleship itself is not a singular privilege that one hugs to oneself to the exclusion of others.

Disciples minister to the needs of others, whatever those needs may be and with whatever abilities the disciple may possess. There are various kinds of healing: a friendly smile, a word of gratitude, a soothing touch. We can teach the lessons of life in classrooms, in playrooms, in kitchens, in boardrooms. There are many ways that we can cast out the demons that hold our world by the throat; demons of poverty and oppression, demons of addiction and slavery, demons of disdain and neglect, demons of hatred and violence. If they are not cast out by us, then by whom?

The life of discipleship is not an unmixed blessing. Because disciples are marked by the sign of the cross, they must expect suffering. Because they do not live according to the standards of the world, disciples will be judged as fools. Some of them will be subjected to even greater suffering. Still, the disciple proclaims that true fulfilment is only found in God! In reality, it is the world that is upside down, not the life of discipleship. And it is the cross that sets things right.

Dear friends



It is around this time every year that we reflect on our financial support of our parish. This year I encourage all parishioners to now renew your support.

Our Parish is the focus of our faith life, our mission and outreach as disciples of Jesus. We support not only each other in our Church community but our wonderful Parish School, St Matthews and our wider community.

Your financial support is the backbone of our parish activities and outreach, some of which can often go on quietly behind the scenes.

We continue to support the ladies craft group who meet in the Parish Centre each week and apart from the beautiful craft-work they produce, it is a tremendous support network for ladies, and it continues to grow. Our parish will also be offering assistance to those young people from our parish who would like to go to World Youth Day in Portugal next year.

Our outreach to the sick and housebound in our parish, our hospital and nursing homes brings great spiritual and emotional comfort to many and helps these people to feel connected to our parish. We support the great work of St Vincent de Paul through our parish resources. We hope to host our community light lunches in the coming months, after our 12.30pm Friday Mass. We look forward to welcoming our new parishioners with a special dinner on the 22nd July. Regular morning teas are hosted in the presbytery for parishioners to attend and socialise, after our weekday Masses.

Our parish nourishes and supports the growth in faith and love of each parishioner beginning with the support of young parents in their baptism preparation, through the steps in faith from the parish sacramental programs for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation, to the many young couples being prepared for marriage. The parish has continued to nurture our faith through our sharing of the scriptures in our Word and Faith group. Your financial support helps us do all this and more, so thank you very much.
