# FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - YEAR A 27TH NOVEMBER 2022

First Reading: Is 2:1-5

The Lord will gather all nations in eternal peace in the kingdom of God.

Responsorial Psalm: <u>Ps 121:1-2. 4-5. 6-9. R. see v.1.</u> (R.) Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

I rejoiced when I heard them say: 'Let us go to God's house.' And now our feet are standing within your gates, O Jerusalem. (R.)

It is there that the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord. For Israel's law it is, there to praise the Lord's name. There were set the thrones of judgement of the house of David. (R.)

For the peace of Jerusalem pray: 'Peace be to your homes! May peace reign in your walls, in your palaces, peace!'. (R.)

For love of my brethren and friends I say: 'Peace upon you!'
For love of the house of the Lord I will ask for your good. (R.)

Second Reading: Rom 13:11-14

The time has come, our salvation is near.

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mt 24:37-44

Stay awake, you must be ready.

#### **BLESSING OF THE ADVENT WREATH**

**PRIEST**: God of all time and all seasons, you are the beginning and the end of all life, and your love for us is evergreen and eternal. As we begin our Advent time of preparing our hearts and minds for the birth of your Son, Jesus, we ask you to bless this wreath, that it may be a sacred symbol bringing grace and blessing to us as we use it during our Advent journey.

**ALL: Amen** 

**PRIEST**: May this violet light remind us that we are waiting and longing for the coming of Jesus who is the true light of the world?



#### ALL: We wait and long for Jesus, the light of the world.

For many Catholic families, the centrepiece of their Advent celebration is the Advent Wreath. It is a very simple item, consisting of four candles, surrounded by evergreen branches. The light of the candles signifies the light of Christ, who will come into the world at Christmas. Add a candle to the centre at Christmas (Christ's candle).

Children, in particular, find delight in the ceremony of the Advent Wreath, and it's a great way to remind them that, while there are Christmas specials on TV and the Christmas music in stores, we are still waiting for the birth of Jesus.

If you have never adopted this practice, what are you waiting for? Shape your frame from wire or purchase one from a craft shop, buy some candles and collect some greenery and pine cones. Simple, but effective. Light a candle each week with your family and pray the prayer together from the bulletin.

# **REFLECTION** by Dianne Bergant CSA

We may be accustomed to think of Advent as the time when we prepare for the coming of God, but the readings also train our attention on our own journey to God. We see this most clearly in this first Sunday with readings that tell us the identity of the pilgrims, the destination toward which they travel, and the way of life that is required of them on their journey. As the Vatican Council has proclaimed: We are a pilgrim people.

Both the reading from Isaiah and the psalm response speak of the pilgrimage to the mountain of the Lord, the place where God can be found. Although the psalm speaks about Jerusalem and refers to the temple there, the broader theological significance of the mountain, the city and the temple is one and the same. They represent the presence of God in our midst, and this presence is the goal of our striving. There are clear directions about how we are to live while we are on this pilgrimage to God. In Isaiah we learn that we must put away our instruments of violence and hatred, our swords and our spears. Lest we pick them up again, we are told to convert them into life-producing implements, into ploughs and pruning hooks. Paul exhorts us to put away our deeds of darkness and self-indulgence and to clothe ourselves instead in the deeds of Jesus Christ. Matthew points out the need for alertness, attentiveness, a disposition that is open to a change of heart.

FR THAO'S FAREWELL 5.30PM SUNDAY 11TH DECEMBER 2022 IN THE CHURCH GROUNDS





#### *Historical Context* – The Advent Wreath

One of the major symbols of the Advent season is the wreath. The encircling wreath is symbolic of God without beginning or end and the green foliage represents our hope in God. There are usually five candles in the wreath, a central white candle representing the light of Christ that came into the world and then four outside candles that are usually purple and rose coloured. The first candle is generally symbolic of Hope and Expectation. The third candle – the rose or pink candle – celebrates the Joy that is anticipated in the coming of Christ. The progressive lighting of the candles marks the journey towards the Nativity.
