Where sin increased, there grace abounded all the more.


Gospel Acclamation:

LENT 2023

The Season of Lent is a journey to the celebration of Easter. Like all journeys, it can have its moments of difficulty and discomfort. We keep going because we hope to arrive at a destination better than the place where we started.



Pope Francis has drawn a comparison between the Lenten journey and the synodal journey that he has called the Church to follow. My own recent Pastoral Letter to you reflecting on the synodal path for our local church was entitled "Are We There Yet?" This was to acknowledge the weariness and the temptation to lose hope that a people on pilgrimage can experience.

We need the gift of patience from God, who is always patient with us, even when we grow impatient with him. We also pray for patience with one another, which St Augustine called the sacrifice of being Christian.

The individual and communal paths of conversion must intertwine during Lent if our journey is to arrive at the destination where God awaits. Let us never forget that we are travelling together; and that every day presents opportunities for simple, practical acts of love and forgiveness that can be our gift to one another.



The Gulgong Catholic Women's Group wish to advise their Annual General Meeting will be held on Tuesday 7th March, at 2pm, in the Convent.



St Matthews New House Patrons

Following on from last weeks bulletin, below is more information about the New House Patrons for St Matthews Catholic School.

Following the 2021 school review, there was a recommendation that St Matthews rename the house Patrons in honour individuals who reflect our Catholic Identity. In consultation with students, staff, parents and the Priests of the Parish, a selection criteria was established.

MacKillop House - In honour of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop (1842 - 1909) - Australia

Mary MacKillop, along with Fr Julian Tenison Woods, founded the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart in 1866. She dedicated her life to doing God's work including opening schools, orphanages, and shelters for women. MacKillop embodies St Matthews Way particularly through her compassionate service of others, and her courageous willingness to endure hardships and adversity. As Australia's first saint, she is a shining example of a call to holiness.

O'Connor House - In honour of the Servant of God Eileen O'Connor (1892-1921) - Australia

Eilleen O'Connor founded Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor at the age of 21 to provide care for the sick and disabled in their own homes. At that time there was no government support for such a service. The fact that Eileen developed this service whilst suffering a lifetime of crippling pain is highly inspiring.

She demonstrated incredible courage in the face of immense trials both physically and socially. Eileen earned the affectionate nickname, The Little Mother.

"The cause of a person's poverty is not yours to question. The fact the person is poor is the reason you help" - Eileen O'Connor

Ozanam House - In honour of Blessed Frederic Ozanam (1813-1853) - France

Frederic Ozanam began the Society of St Vincent de Paul as a response to the challenge: "What do you do besides talk to prove the faith you claim is in you?" Like St Matthew, Ozanam was called to do more and lived a life of compassion and service to the poor of France. He founded Vinnies on his 20th birthday and demonstrates the ability of young people to see the needs of their world and respond in new and meaningful ways. Furthermore, his fine career as a professor of law and journalist exemplifies the importance of striving for excellence in all facets of life.

Romero House - In honour of St Oscar Romero (1917-1980) - El Salvador

Like St Matthew, who turned from tax collecting to the message of the Gospel, Oscar Romero had a radical transformation to a prophetic voice challenging the social injustices of his time. His opposition to the military dictatorship of El Salvador and advocacy of the voiceless is the embodiment of courage. Despite his assassination, Romero's witness of the Gospel and ongoing legacy is a living example of the school's motto "Truth and Excellence Will Prevail."

Congratulations to our St Matthew's School Community on the opening and blessing of the New Campus by Bishop Michael this coming Tuesday. The New school has been fully funded by the Catholic Diocese of Bathurst on land purchased by St Mary's Parish Mudgee. May it be a place of excellence in the spiritual, academic and human development of young woman and man of the future.

Laxmi, 16, lives in in Jajarkot, a remote district in Nepal where almost half of the population live below the poverty line.
