REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Our religious tradition is founded on love. Actually, life itself is grounded in love. We may not always feel this love, but if we allow ourselves to reflect on life, we will realise this truth. We have been called into being by God's love; and we will only be happy if we live in that love. Thus, when we are directed to love God and love one another, we are not being asked to do something contrary to our nature. Rather, we are being told to live in accord with that nature. We come from God who is love, and so it is in our very nature to love and to be loved.

We may sometimes think that it is easier to love God than to love others. It may actually be just the opposite. Other people are tangible. We can see and hear them, interact with them. Their influence in our lives can permeate our consciousness. That is not the way it is with God. Like Moses on the mountain, we can only see the traces of divinity as God passes by (see Ex 33:23). However, we show that we love God in the way we love our neighbour.

Love, the foundation of the reign of God, is contagious. When we love others, the reign of God spreads throughout the world. The compassion that we show toward others is a form of evangelisation. It proclaims much louder than any words that the reign of God has been established.

God's Word

Being God for Others

A major theme of the Scripture readings is 'Love God and others'.

The author of Exodus reminds the Israelites what it was like to be aliens in a strange land, as a way to teach them to reach out to others in need. God gives the Israelites special instructions to welcome strangers, care for widows and orphans, and expect no interest on loans. God hears the cries of those in need and comes to their aid – through our own hands.




The psalm is a profession of love and confidence that God is always there — strong as a rock, stronger than a rock. The psalmist gives God many strong titles: strength, rock, fortress, shield, stronghold. This hymn thanks God for keeping us safe, out of harm's way.

The reading from Paul's First letter to the Thessalonians praises them for turning away from idols and accepting the word of Jesus proclaimed by Paul. They have become a model and an inspiration for other Christian communities around them.

By Jesus' day, Judaism had compiled an extensive list of laws that were followed in God's name. In the Gospel reading, the Jews tried to trap Jesus again by asking which of the hundreds of laws were most important.

Instead of picking one, Jesus summarised all the laws with two: 'Love . . . God with your whole heart, with your whole soul, and with all your mind', and 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'

Actually, these laws were not new to the Jews. Jesus sums up all the teaching of the law and the prophets in these two commandments, and in doing so, he gave this guide for living a Christian life.





Church Cleaning - Mudgee

Volunteers are **NEEDED** to clean the church on the first Wednesday of each Month, starting on Wednesday 1st November. Cleaning will start at 9.30am and usually takes about two hours.



November is a special time to pray for the dead. A plenary indulgence may be gained for the dead, once only, by visiting a church on 2 November and praying the Lord's Prayer and the Creed. Three conditions are required for gaining the indulgence: sacramental confession, eucharistic communion, and prayer for the pope's intentions (Norms 15.7)

Here are some further things we could do in November to help the souls in purgatory:

Offering Masses for them. This is the best way to remember the departed souls because mass is a precious gift, the sacrificial offering that our Lord Jesus Christ offered on the cross to the Father to save us from sin (death). Jesus's blood poured out on the cross benefits everyone whether they are alive or dead.

Visit Cemeteries to Pray: Cemeteries are not just places to bury the dead. They are also holy places where we can go to visit and pray for those who have passed away. From 1st – 8th November, we could gain a plenary indulgence for the dead when visiting Cemeteries to pray for them.

Visit Someone Who Is Grieving: caring for the dead also asks us to care for bereaved persons as well. Giving them a call, taking them out for a meal, or offering a prayer like the Our Father or Hail Mary can be a great comfort to bereaved persons at this time.

November - Book of Remembrance

During November the Mass request of all the deceased will be written in the Book of Remembrance. The book will remain in the St Mary's Church for all Masses during the week and taken up at Offertory Procession during the weekend Masses.

If you would like names added to the book, please write them clearly on a November Mass envelope and either place them on the collection plate or take them to the Parish Office. The November Mass envelopes are available in the church.
