Gospel: <u>Matthew 25:1-13</u> Look, the bridegroom comes. Go out to meet him.




Prison Ministry

The Diocese of Bathurst has many correctional facilities that house those who are vulnerable and need to see and feel the love of God. These facilities include Lithgow, Oberon, Kirkconnell, Bathurst, Wellington and Macquarie (also in Wellington).

Visiting prisoners is one of the Corporal Works of Mercy. The Diocese of Bathurst has a dedicated team of Prison Chaplains who minister within the walls of these facilities each and every day. They bring Jesus to those who have committed crimes and made mistakes. They fulfil the command of Jesus to help those who need it the most.

Catholic Chaplains work closely with Chaplains from other denominations and faiths and regularly make a substantial difference in the lives of more than 1,700 men and women who are imprisoned in our region.

This ministry extends beyond the gates of the Correctional facilities across the Diocese as there are always opportunities for those who wish to help in simple ways that can transform lives. Now I Lay Me Down to Sleep

A major theme of the Scripture readings is 'Be prepared'.

In the first reading, God's wisdom is described in human terms. Wisdom makes sure she is easily found, but we still need to search for her. She is knowledge of God and knowledge of all the good things God has made. Likewise, when we have wisdom, we have relationship with God. Like wisdom, God is always there for us. God calls us through the Scriptures and nature and other people, but we need to look, listen and respond.

The psalmist has a strong yearning for God, like someone who has been without water for a long time and is driven by thirst. The psalmist praises and glorifies God, who satisfies all our hungers and thirsts. Even at night the psalmist prays and meditates with God.

In the second reading, we hear how members of the Thessalonian church, eagerly waiting for Jesus to return, are saddened when their members begin to die before the Lord comes. Paul consoles them by telling them that God has raised Christ so they can be confident that God will raise all with him. The dead will rise again when Christ returns, and we will rejoin them in the heavens. Nothing can separate us from Jesus, not even death.



The parable of the ten bridesmaids is like the Scout motto, 'Be prepared'. In the Gospel reading, Jesus tells a story of ten women waiting to welcome the groom to the wedding celebration. All took torches, but only five brought extra oil. The groom did not arrive until midnight. While the five foolish bridesmaids went to buy more oil, the five sensible ones greeted the groom with bright torches. When the five foolish ones returned, the door was closed and the master refused to let them in. Jesus ends with the admonition, 'Keep your eyes open, for you know not the day or the hour.'

This story is about the expected return of Christ. It is not enough to just wait for his final return. We believe that Jesus can come and be present at any time. We have to be prepared at all times.

The Hour and the Time

Israel was often portrayed as a bride in Jewish scriptures. So, the question was: 'When would the Bridegroom – the Anointed One of God, the Christ – appear?' Jesus' warning is to the attendants of the bride: 'Be alert, be vigilant, be prepared.' Some (the five foolish attendants) did miss the moment: the earthly ministry of Jesus of Nazareth.

But his warning is also for the Catholic Church which is the new Bride of Christ. We are the attendants to the Bride and the imperative applies to us also: Be alert, be vigilant. Be prepared for the eruption, the intervention of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Bridegroom, into our history, into our moment

For example, is Christ coming to meet us in the modern movements which demand to hold authority accountable, or which press for just recognition of women? We can foolishly remain in the dark or we can wisely try to throw light on these questions. Only then we will be able to discern whether indeed it is the Lord who is approaching.

We could pause to pray that we be ready when the Bridegroom responds to the ancient prayer: 'Come, Lord Jesus!'
