REFLECTION by Nick Brodie

In his apostolic exhortation 'on love in the family', Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis reminds us that 'no family drops down from heaven perfectly formed.' Rather, 'families need constantly to grow and mature in the ability to love.'

'In imitation of the Holy Family,' the Pope said a few years ago, 'we are called to rediscover the educational value of the family unit.' The Holy Family is clearly dear to Pope Francis' heart. He closes *Amoris Laetitia* with a prayer which partly runs: 'Holy Family of Nazareth, grant that our families too, may be places of communion and prayer, authentic schools of the Gospel and small domestic churches.'

This image of families as 'schools of the Gospel' is a useful one, provided we look with clear eyes.

On the one hand we should strive to love like the Holy Family loved, doing right by each other, sharing life's journey together, and so on. Meanwhile, we should also learn to love the families of our own times and listen to their needs. Many families experience trials of rejection, hostility, and displacement – just as the Holy Family did – and so our own family has a responsibility to love beyond itself. We must love and care for other families too.
